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## **Subtask 4.4.1 Awareness raising of Europeana in Coordination with the Commission**

Council Conclusions of May 2016 required that Member States could better understand and contribute to the value of Europeana, give permanent access to country specific user-statistics and improve the accountability on project result and spending.

This work required a constant dialogue with MS and European Institutions and awareness raising of the existence of Europeana as a resource for education, creative industries, research and the cultural industry sector.

Requirements for improvement of the platform and joint policies and recommendations created for the reuse of cultural heritage in the development of economic growth and jobs for the support of the single market. The outcome is a series of country reports and set of requirements for incorporation in subsequent Europeana Business plans so that Europeana DSI serves as a digital cultural heritage material platform for education, research, tourism and creative industry and fulfils the needs of MS.

Over the course of DSI2 a number of activities were undertaken to fulfill this milestone: meetings with European bodies and MS representatives; two presidencies events (Latvia and Malta); country reports for each country; active collection of feedback at MSEG/DHCE meetings and from CEF Committee members; a telephone survey of MS to discuss input to the Strategic Plan, set up of MS pages on Europeana; greater inclusion of MS in the Governing Board of Europeana Foundation; increased communication via an MS newsletter


### **Member States**

#### **Europeana Foundation Governing Board**

After publication of Council Conclusions on Europeana in May 2016, the Europeana Foundation Governing Board voted to increase MS representation by including the preceding and succeeding presidencies as voting members and extending terms to 18 months. There are now three MS representatives in the Board of 19 voting members. These members communicate with the whole of the DCHE in a two way process

Responding to Council Conclusions call for better understanding and contribution to the value of Europeana, several actions have been taken under DSI2. These include the appointment of a Member States Liaison Officer to support communication to and from MS. As part of this effort an area of Europeana Pro has been dedicated to pulling together all of the information of use to MS.

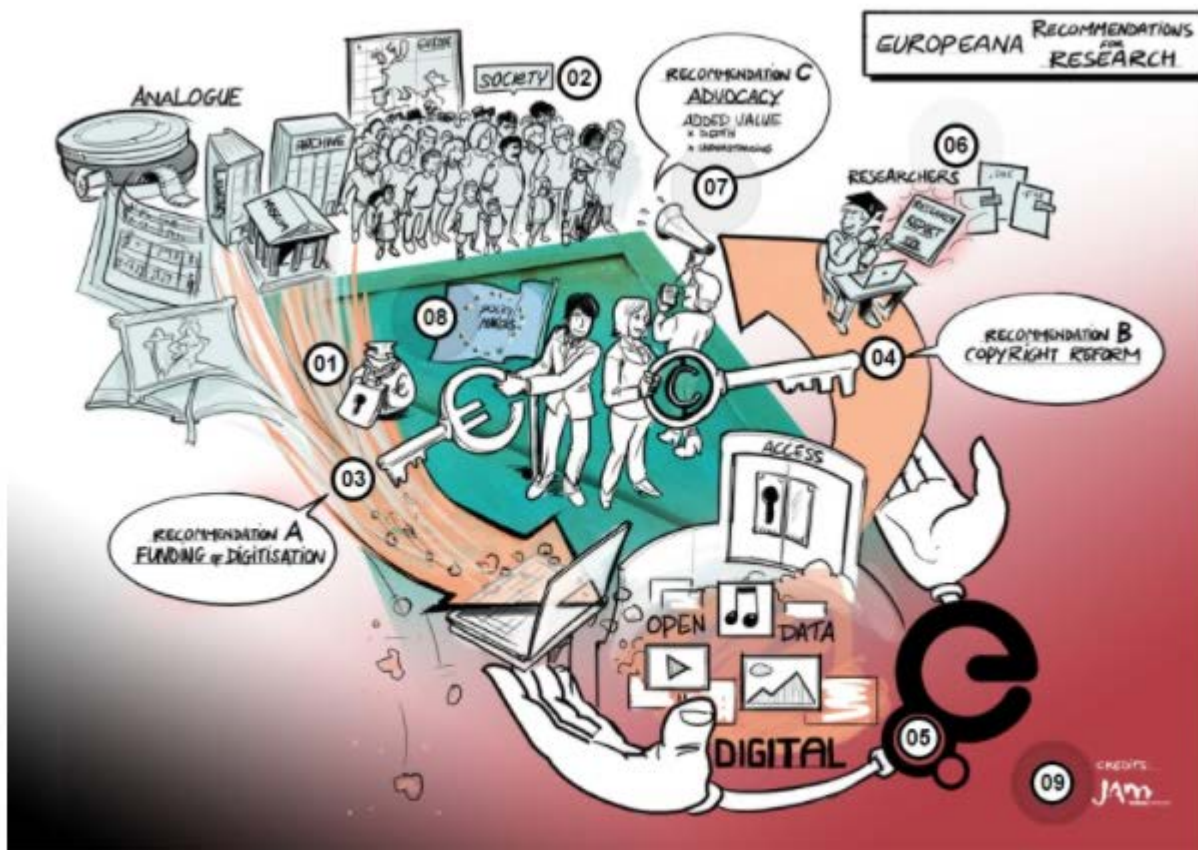

## Presidency events

Under the Luxembourg Presidency the first set of recommendations for Europeana for Smart Cities was worked on together with policy makers from Ministries of Culture and Ministries of Tourism. The results were a [graphic drawing](#) showing the possibilities of Cultural Heritage as a pillar for Smart Cities. These were pulled together in a whitepaper, which was published in the Autumn of 2016. This has been read widely and referenced by many countries and EC policy makers.

The Latvian Presidency saw the revisiting of the Europeana for Research Recommendations originally compiled under the Greek Presidency. These were reduced in scope to the essentials and represented in the following graphic:



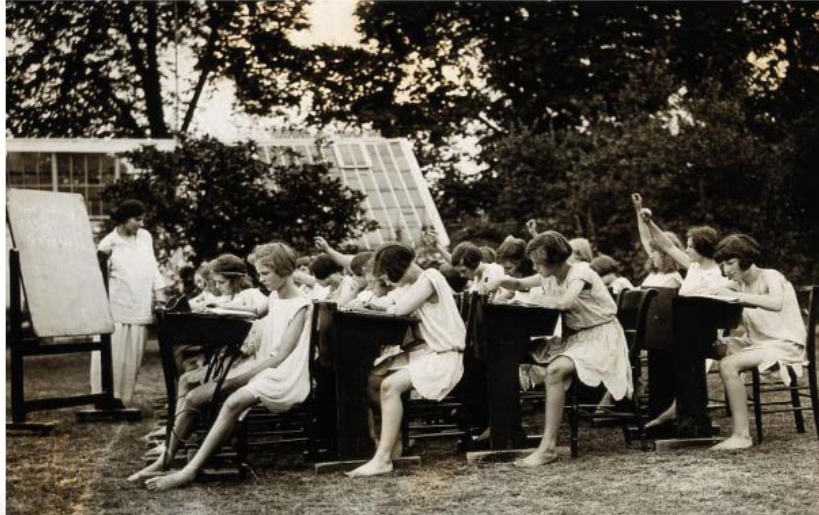

Under the Maltese Presidency the Ministries of Culture and Education revisited the Europeana for Education Recommendations



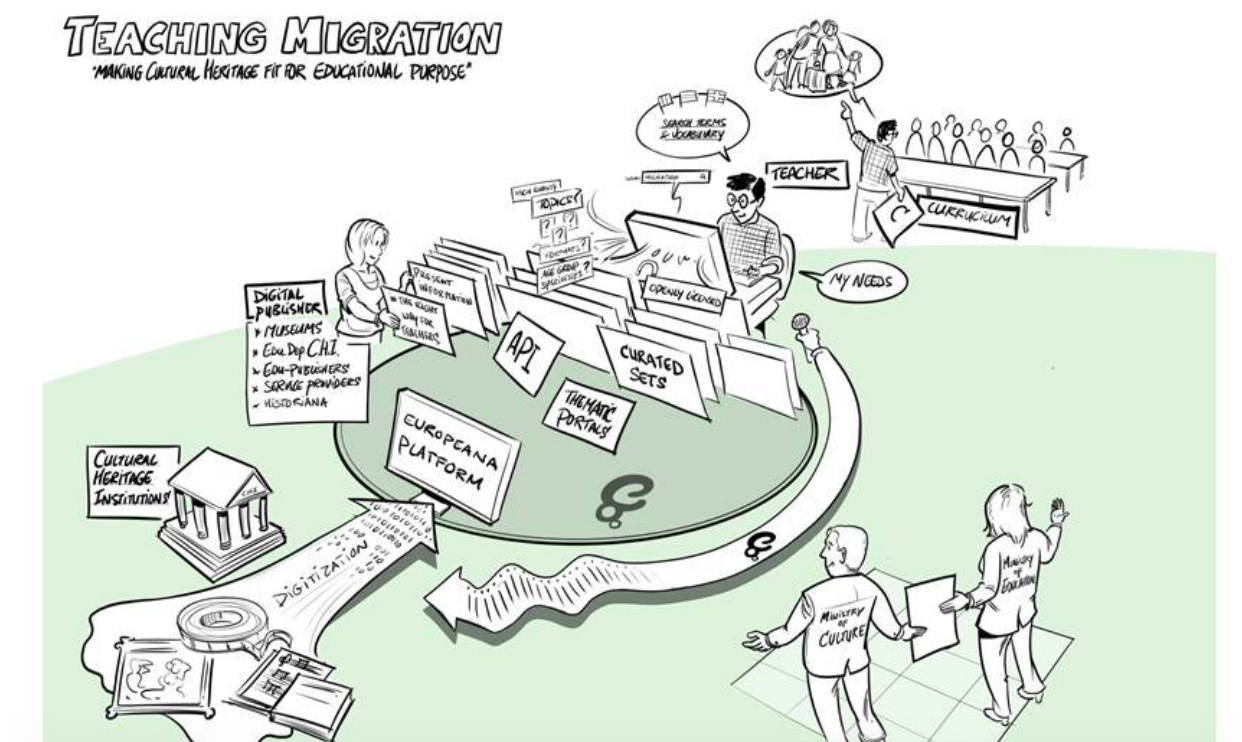
## Europeana for Education and Learning

*Original Policy Recommendations of Europeana for Education, published May 2015*

With the aim of creating a more actionable and communicable set to pursue over the next year. A check is being made to finalise with the attending Ministries the resulting draft actions during August and the final set will be published in September. The actions and recommendations will be sent to policy makers and Ministry representatives and will be disseminated towards Europeana Network through blogs on Pro and the Network newsletter.



Each set of Recommendations are published and communicated and followed up.

 To date, Estonia has contributed €93,500 to the funding of Europeana.  
 To date, Europeana enabled contribution of €7,238 from the budget of the EU to fund Europeana projects in Estonia.

**Participation in projects**  
 To date, no Estonian partner contributes in EU-funded projects to Europeana. However, 3 partners of Estonia finished in 2015 3 EU-funded projects which contributed to Europeana. These projects directly support knowledge and technology sharing between libraries, museums, archives, software agencies and university research departments. The activities include delivering content, technology and knowledge to Europeana.

*Country Report on Europeana Pro*

The overall statistics site - launched in Beta last year - has thrown up many inaccuracies in the data, due to the data itself. The information on traffic and impact is now included in the Country Reports. Further work will be done with cultural heritage institutions to improve the ability to actively record statistics and an investigation is scheduled to decide how best to record statistics coming from third party usage e.g.: wikipedia. in a consistent manner.

DCHE members are encouraged to report back on Country Reports.
