3. PRIORITY AREAS AND **ACTIVITIES IN 2023**

The priority areas for 2023 are:

- 1. Supporting engagement with the academic and research communities in the common European data space for cultural heritage.
- 2. Providing guidance and insight to the community in the complex European heritage and research ecosystem(s).
- 3. Further developing a presence and promoting the common European data space for cultural heritage in communities of academics and researchers interested in digital scholarship and of professionals interested in digital cultural heritage.

The special activities for 2023 are:

- Organising the feedback on the "Collections as Data" workflow that will be developed by the Europeana Foundation and DARIAH.
- Writing and publishing a practical guide for humanities scholars to the European digital cultural heritage and research infrastructures.



In addition to these special activities, we will continue our regular activities:

- Organising a regular online Europeana Research Café, an informal space for sharing best practices and discussing new insights;
- Presenting the work of the community on Collections as Data, Datasheets for Digital Cultural Heritage and the common European data space for cultural heritage at relevant workshops and conferences.

Finally, we will introduce a new regular activity: organising online hands-on workshops.

All activities are targeted at cultural heritage professionals, academics and researchers alike.



4. CONTRIBUTING TO THE PRIORITIES OF THE ENA

The Research Community work plan for 2023 contributes to the strategic priorities of the Europeana Network Association in a number of ways:

- Supporting capacity building and digital transformation in cultural heritage institutions, especially capacity building of professionals who deal with academics, university students and researchers in their daily work, by supporting them in understanding the needs existing in the academic and research sector where it comes to the reuse of digital cultural heritage, and in developing new workflows to make data reusable.

- Collaboration with the Europeana Foundation, Europeana Aggregators' Forum and wider networks, by relying on the structural collaboration with the Europeana Research initiative and aligning the community's objectives with this initiative and its partners in academia and research within the common European data space for cultural heritage, especially DARIAH | Digital Research Infrastructure for the Arts and Humanities.
